Introduction to the Season of Creation*

Today's focus is on the Season of Creation, an annual ecumenical celebration around the world that unites us to be reminded of the importance to care for our common home, God's creation.

The celebration of the season begins on September 1, also known as the Feast of Creation, and ends October 4, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations.

Each year, the Season of Creation Ecumenical Steering Committee proposes a theme for the Season of Creation. The theme for 2025 is "Peace with Creation" and the symbol is "Garden of Peace", inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18.

Humanity was originally called to tend a garden. As we worship, and continue our thanksgiving as we leave this place, we are invited to reflect on the connection between caring for creation and fostering peace.

Confession and Forgiveness*

Triune God, Creator of all, we praise you for your goodness, visible in all the diversity that you have created, making us a cosmic family living in a common home. Through the Earth you created, we experience love and nourishment, home and protection.

We confess that we do not always think of the Earth as a gift from you, our Creator. Our selfishness, greed, neglect, and abuse have caused the climate crisis, loss of biodiversity, human suffering as well as the suffering of our fellow creatures.

Loving and Creator God, we pray that you will make us sensitive to the needs of your creation and enable us to have the same compassion as that of Jesus, our redeemer.

Words of Forgiveness

May God grant us a fresh vision of our relationship with Creation, and with one another, as diverse people that are all made in God's image. Your sins are forgiven in the name of the + Creating God, Redeeming Son, and the Sustaining Spirit. Amen

We pray for your Church, that we may be a messenger of life and an agent of your love throughout the world. Instill courage in the hearts of those who follow you, that we may dare to proclaim hope to those who live in fear, encouragement to those who doubt, comfort to those who despair. Give your Church the strength of unity to proclaim your Gospel in word and deed as part of the world in crisis. God of Creation, **receive our prayer.**

We pray for the sick, the destitute, the oppressed and the vulnerable. We pray for our fellow human beings and for all of creation affected by war, conflict, genocide, and ecocide. Serve justice to those who cry out to you, and to those who have no ability to cry out. Give us the courage to act on behalf of those who silently endure injustice and guide our steps in the way of righteous and long-lasting peace. Act in our world your life-giving will. God of Creation, **receive our prayer.**

Creating God, grant that the future of the world, of humanity, of the Church and of all people may be in your hands, and that we may live in true hope, justice, and peace for the sake of Jesus Christ. Amen.
