Introduction

We celebrate Reformation Sunday today, a day that we celebrate our Lutheran heritage, because October 31, 1517 was the day that Martin Luther posted the 95 Thesis on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. This set off a chain of events that evolved into our Lutheran tradition. Martin Luther stood up to the institutional church of his time, using the Bible as the guide to his faith and conscience, as he challenged the church to return to the teachings of Jesus. Celebrating our Lutheran heritage, we also remember God's covenant to us that we acknowledge and celebrate through our baptism. Covenant is a "churchy" word for promise or agreement. This day we "covenant" with our confirmation youth — make promises to them - to support and nurture them in their lives of faith during their confirmation journey and beyond.

Confirmation Covenanting
