### ON YOUR MARK.. GET SET.. GO!!!!

Except that it is anything but a race!!!!

For indeed.. the metaphor of "journey" is perfect for the season of Lent but it is NOT a race... NOT a headlong dash to "get it over with". (And there certainly is NO "winner".)

Lent is, in fact, a season to move more slowly.. a season to take time to pause occasionally.. to take an extra minute/moment here and there to do what we so seldom take time to do! For we who dare the "discipline of Lent",

the intention of this time is to use these days of journeying with Jesus to and through the cross as opportunity to focus a bit more on the spiritual hungers we all have. (And yes we do ALL have them.) It is a time for some to "give something up". for others to "take something up". In both cases the point is to let that little extra bit of sacrifice remind you of (both) how selfish we can often be AND how little it takes to make the world a better place. So whether you give up chocolate (or whatever) or you take up a more regular time of prayer/study/Bible-reading/serving/etc, the hope is that in those moments you take out of the ordinary routine of life, you can get a chance to re-focus on who God is for you and what God promises you.

And *then* we move ever so inexorably closer and closer to those days when "Last Suppers" and stark crosses begin to appear on the horizon, we will maybe be a bit more engaged with how powerful those days can be. We will maybe be a bit more ready to hear and let in, what the story of Jesus's incredible love for us can do to us.

And so I invite you to daily or weekly take at least a minute or two to DO LENT – in whatever way works for you: join us for soup & prayer; pick up a new devotional reader; re-read the passion story in one or more of the Gospels; make worship a bit more of a priority; find a couple of new ways to serve or give in your community; WHATEVER!!!?! I promise that the work of lifting your eyes up from the regular chaos of our lives to look a bit more often at the world around us (AND to God) WILL be worth the effort.

Christians on Climate Change Please join us on March 8 at 7:00 at Living Spirit Centre for a brief presentation by Mary Vetter and David Sauchyn, followed by discussion, to explore the consequences of a warming climate for our part of the world. While science gives us tools for understanding how and why the climate is changing, by itself it cannot give us the wisdom we need to address the challenges. We need other resources, for example scriptures, faith, empathy, experience, and scholarship. The steps identified by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission for reconciliation between settler and indigenous peoples can be applied also to help us address the consequences of climate change: awareness of the past, acknowledgement of the harm that has been inflicted, atonement for the causes, and action to change behaviour.

News from the Regina Lutheran Refugee Committee: We are excited to report that Syrian refugees Walaa (age 22), her husband Mohammad (age 25) and their baby boy Amer will be coming to Regina very soon (we hope in May). On February 3 they were interviewed at the Canadian consulate in Amman, Jordan, and they have been accepted into Canada! Walaa has Type 1 diabetes and has not been able to get a reliable supply of insulin in the refugee camp. But we can help her get her insulin here, and give this family the chance for a new life.

Now is the time for our ELCIC congregations to get ready for their arrival! If you would like to donate to the sponsorship, please make checks payable to your church and mark them Refugee Fund. As we set up a home for them, we have all the furniture we need, but we are still looking for a crib, a stroller, a high chair, and an up-to-date car seat. We also could also use donations of Pampers (six and nine and 12 month sizes), area rugs, baby blankets, individual spices, and pots and pans. Thank you for helping to welcome the stranger!
