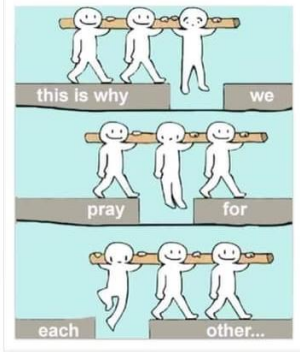
EASTER ALLELUIA BREAKFAST!!
