

Immanuel Anglican will be hosting a Kairos Blanket Exercise. All are welcome. The **Blanket Exercise will** be held Sunday, June 19, at 11:30 at Campbell Collegiate High School (102 Massey Road), next door to the north of Immanuel church. Please use the main door at Campbell Collegiate that is closest to Immanuel. The Kairos Blanket Exercise is an interactive learning experience that teaches the Indigenous rights that is rarely taught. It was developed in response to the 1996 Report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples as a highly recommended education method regarding Canadian Indigenous history as one of the key steps to reconciliation. The Blanket Exercise covers 500 years of history in a one-and-a-half-hour participatory workshop. It is a very powerful workshop.

Friday, June 3, 10:30 – 11:30 am How We Acquired the Dreamcatcher Presenter: Lynn Cote

The origin and meaning behind the dreamcatcher will be discussed during the presentation. The presentation will include the assembling of a dream catcher using willow and string, and the story will be told and explanation of the objects used when making dreamcatchers.

Friday, June 10, 10:30 – 11:30 am A Bird's Eye View! An Indigenous Journalist's Journey Presenter: Nelson Bird

Nelson Bird will share stories of the journey on being a mainstream journalist for more than 25 years. He is one of only a handful of Indigenous journalists in Canada and his perspectives, experiences and history will enlighten audiences with stories of humour, adventure, triumphs and tragedies. Nelson who is from Peepeekisis Cree Nation will talk about how growing up a reserve has moulded his career and objectives in life.

Friday, June 17, 10:30 – 11:30 am First Nations Challenges

Presenter: Betty Nippi-Albright

Betty Nippi-Albright will speak on being the only First Nations, female MLA in the Province of Saskatchewan via Z. This will include challenges, and rewards as well as the racism Ms. Nippi-Albright has faced since being elected. Betty Nippi-Albright is a strong advocate for the rights of all citizens of Saskatchewan, and will touch on our province's Duty to Consult policy, MMIWG2S (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit People), Systemic Racism, and the work she has done in the Legislative Assembly to date.

Decade of Indigenous Languages: Indigenous Language Revitalization from Cradle to Grave Andrea Custer, First Nations University of Canada

Andrea currently works at First Nations University of Canada as a Cree Language Lecturer and Program Coordinator for the Indigenous Languages and Linguistics program in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. For most of her professional life, Andrea has been focused on teaching Cree language –from elementary school, junior high, high school and now in a university setting.

Andrea volunteers as president for the Rock Cree Language Council Inc., as Secretary for the Foundation of Endangered Languages (FEL) Canada Chapter and is the co-host of the podcast "Cree and Coffee with the Crazy Crees" through the pikiskwewin project at First Nations University. www.pikiskwewin.ca
