GATHERING (ELW p. 262)

HYMN O Sacred Head, Now Wounded (isometric) (ELW 351)

PRAYER OF THE DAY (ELW p. 262). Let us pray. Almighty God, look with loving mercy on your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, to be given over to the hands of sinners, and to suffer death on the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING: Isaiah 52:13--53:12. A reading from Isaiah.

The fourth servant poem promises ultimate vindication for the servant, who made his life an offering for sin. The servant pours himself out to death and is numbered with the transgressors, images that the early church saw as important keys for understanding the death of Jesus.
